KEY DIFFERENCES BETWEEN BOARD OF NURSING AND PROFESSIONAL NURSE ASSOCIATION

BOARD OF NURSING

- Regulatory body.
- Ensures public safety by regulating nursing practice.
- Mandatory for licensed nurses within a jurisdiction.
- Establishes and enforces regulations, issues licenses, handles disciplinary actions.
- Legal authority granted by the government.

PROFESSIONAL NURSE ASSOCIATION

- Voluntary organization.
- Supports and advocates for member nurses.
- Optional; nurses choose to join.
- Offers support, resources, and advocacy.
- No regulatory authority; focuses on advocacy and education.

OVERVIEW OF THE MARYLAND BOARD OF NURSING

Role and Purpose

- Regulates nursing practice within the state of Maryland.
- Ensures nurses meet qualifications and adhere to professional standards.

Composition of the Board

- Registered Nurses (RNs)
- Licensed Practical Nurses (LPNs)
- Advanced Practice Registered Nurses (APRNs)
- Public Members (Non-nursing individuals)

BECOMING A BOARD MEMBER

Appointment Process

- Nomination by nursing organizations or individuals.
- Review and appointment by the Governor of Maryland.
- Possible confirmation by the Maryland State
 Senate.

Qualifications and Expectations

• Commitment to promoting the nursing profession and public welfare.

Term of Service

 Serve for a specified term, with possible renewals or extensions.

Resources and Application

 Consult official sources and the Maryland Department of Health for the latest information and application procedures.

INFLUENCE ON NURSE'S ROLE

- Empowers RNs with more responsibilities.
- Fosters patient-centered care.
- Increases professional development demands.
- Encourages continuous learning.
- Promotes nursing autonomy.
- Requires adherence to regulations.

INFLUENCE ON HEALTHCARE DELIVERY, COST, AND ACCESS

- Enhances care efficiency and availability.
- Reduces specialist intervention needs.
- Lowers healthcare costs.
- Expands access to care.
- Increases healthcare workforce capacity.
- Facilitates care in underserved areas.

CULTURAL SENSITIVITY AND PATIENT CARE

- Cultural awareness for diverse patient needs.
- Builds trust and rapport.
- Fosters effective communication.
- Enhances patient satisfaction.
- Supports tailored care plans.

MARYLAND STATE REGULATION ON APRNS

- Maryland grants Full Practice Authority to APRNs.
- NPs, CNMs, CNSs, and CRNAs can practice independently.
- APRNs can diagnose, treat, order tests, and prescribe.
- No mandatory physician collaboration is required.
- This regulation reflects trust in APRNs' advanced training.
- It empowers APRNs to practice autonomously.

INFLUENCE ON HEALTHCARE DELIVERY, COST, AND ACCESS

- Full practice authority enhances healthcare delivery.
- APRNs offer a broader range of services.
- This may reduce wait times and improve access.
- Cost efficiency is promoted through APRN optimization.
- They can manage aspects of patient care.
- Expanding access, especially in underserved areas, is a key benefit.

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
